As many of you know, I spend a great deal of time trying to encourage people to evaluate their Spiritual lives in a realistic fashion, pushing them to be more and more critical of the props and rituals that seem to bolster weakness in faith. It's really cute when twoyear-olds are in 10-inchdeep water with inflatable water wings on each arm and a life preserver under their bums while bobbing up and down saying, "I'm swimming! I'm swimming!" But, it generates a totally different thought if it is a forty-year-old man.

Having no desire to be critical or cruel, I persuade folks to try the water for themselves and test their ability to swim without the props and confirmations.

I once heard a preacher giving advice to a smoker to replace his pack of cigarettes with a small New Testament. He went on to tell him (can you hear me in my finest southern accent) that he himself had conquered smoking by just "remembrin' Jesus" whenever he reached for a smoke. (Any of you who have never smoked might think this is a good idea - everyone else are rolling their eyes.)

Is this person better or worse? If you exchange booze for valium - or your snuff box for a bag of chips; if you trade your cross for a Star of David, have you denied yourself or have you denied the truth *about* yourself?

We are pitiful creatures seeking comfort, help, and assurance. We need parents! We need love and someone to trust! Our Father knows this and makes allowances, but think of the forty-year-old in the backyard plastic pool - it ain't funny anymore.

John 20:29, "Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed."

Some are blessed (happy and favored) because they are able to believe without confirmations. Until we figure out why the thumb is in our mouth, we will never even consider taking it out.

A beloved ThINKer struggled with the issue of wearing tzit tzit. Whether to wear them was a question of perfection. If this dear one had struggled with embarrassment, commandment keeping, or general religious issues, I would have counseled differently, but the concern came from a genuine desire for perfection. The issue was finally resolved within and that resolution has been articulated well in this letter which I now share with you:

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LETTER TO TRI

"When my family embraced the instructions given in the Tanak, we studied many Messianic teachings and we willingly wore the fringes as instructed by the Almighty to the children of Israel. We did so because in our understanding at the time it was clearly a commandment given to the nation of Israel and were instructions overseen by Moses.

Our family chose to wear an object specifically instructed by our Creator which was helpful in the natural to remind and direct us; and, although it was not the reason prescribed for them, we found it opened up opportunities to share with others. We believed it was a symbol which reflected our faith and commitment of the Law and Author of the Commandments. After all, we reasoned, our Savior did not wear a cross around His neck or a fish on His garment, but He did wear tzitiot. We concluded that if we were to wear anything, it would be only what had been instructed by our Heavenly Father and not the latest "Christian trend".

Long before the empowerment obtained through

ALL of the Commandments a significant part of our lives. The wearing of the tzit tzit is similar to the remedies and rules found in the Law which speak of cleansing or dealing with various offences which had been committed. If we are not breaking the Laws of Yahweh, we have no need to practice the remedies for these offences. On the other hand, if we continue to break the Commandments of the Almighty, it might be necessary to use whatever physical object or token he has instructed until the observance of His way (the Yah-Way) is second nature to us.

We must remember the Law became more and more complicated because man was so incapable of keeping even the easiest of them. This happened not because the Laws of YHVH were impossible to keep, but because we had not been imparted with grace (power) to keep them. From the time of Pentecost (Shavuot) we have available to us the power to fulfill the requirements and instructions from our Heavenly Father through the Messiah who came to give grace and truth.

John 1:17, "For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ."

We know the Law is "good," so what is the (Continued on page 6)

the baptism of the Spirit by fire, the children of Israel had only the prophets and ceremonial laws containing deep spiritual truths. The Mosaic covenant was a temporary mechanism to keep the children of Israel safe until Messiah could impart His Holy Spirit. COMPETENT TO COUNSEL

by Jay Adams

Modern psychiatry and psychology has proven to be an utter failure for many people, but especially for Christians. Instead of gaining victory over sin through the regenerative work of the Holy Spirit, many Christians are given advice to either modify their behavior, or to choke down yet another drug to mask their symptoms. In his book, Competent to Counsel, Jay Adams advocates a specific type of Christian counseling, one that Paul refers to in Colossians as nouthetic counseling.

"We proclaim him confronting every man nouthetically, and teaching every man with all wisdom in order that we may present every man complete in Christ." ~ Colossians 1:28

According to Paul, we must confront each other nouthetically, that is to say, counsel each other in truth, with knowledge and kindness. This type of counseling is the work of the Holy Spirit, and should be a daily occurrence in the lives of believers. It consists of three basic elements: 1) a problem that must be overcome, 2) an exchange between brethren that truthfully deals with the sin in a person's life (and consequently places full responsibility at the feet of the sinner), and 3) an understanding that the correction is motivated by a deep concern for the individual. The ultimate purpose of nouthetic

counseling is to bring about a lasting change in a person's life so that Jehovah can be glorified. Read this book

to discover how much success this technique has had over traditional psychology methods, how to solve problems nouthetically as a counselor, and how to apply additional teachings associated with this type of counseling. The most helpful and fundamental insight of this book for me is that if I don't love truth in every facet of my life, how can I possibly advise others that they need to as well?

meaning of the following Scripture in Ezekiel?

Ezekiel 20:24-25, "Because they had not executed my judgments, but had despised my statutes, and had polluted my sabbaths, and their eyes were after their fathers' idols. Wherefore I gave them also statutes that were not good, and judgments whereby they should not live;"

It becomes more clear that we must keep our instructions in context and bring forth the provisions of Messiah. Our Savior made changes to the Law. He has not "done away" with any of it, but He has made much of it of no effect to those who are obedient by the power given to us. This truly is the good news of the Gospel!

Do we obey the Law or our Messiah? My family has learned that at times and according to specific situations, we can only obey one of these. When we sought our position concerning self defense and what we would do in these times of trouble, we found a clear provision in the Law for spilling blood (Exodus 22:2), but when we searched the teachings of Messiah we found not one example. Our family had to make a choice to obey the instructions of the Law (the Law of the Letter) or follow the instructions of Messiah (the Law of the Spirit).

If a choice must be made between the Written Word and the Living Word my family has decided to obey the one which creates in us a new heart. We believe the instructions for the tzit tzit fall into this category. The instructions to wear the fringes must give way to the power of Messiah to convert the common sinful person into a new creature the power which allows us to walk in a new nature under the re-newed covenant from the Abrahamic and not the Mosaic covenant."

I remember the day my training wheels (that my dad put on my bike to keep me from falling over) grabbed the ground while I was taking a corner with some speed and flipped me into a ditch. The wreck was not my dad's intention - he was trying to keep me safe. Somewhere along the way... I had learned to ride a bike. Those wheels hadn't 6

touched the ground in months; but, when they did, they thwarted the intention for which they were installed.

Learning better and starting over is grace not disgrace. The Apostle admonished in Hebrews 6:1-3, "Let's leave the dogma of the doctrine of Christ, not laying again the foundation of repentance, and of faith toward God, doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment... let us go on unto perfection!" Do you want this in red ink? Matthew 19:21, "Jesus said unto him, If thou wilt be perfect... follow me."

working long hours trying to keep up with the demands of his new position in management. An ambitious young man, he wants his efforts to be noticed by the "powers that be." He often doesn't make it home in time for dinner and upon arriving finds Lila asleep on the sofa trying to catch up on her sleep.

Neither Hank nor Lila have the time nor the inclination for each other anymore. Happiness is in short supply and their marriage is lifeless. So much effort is needed to maintain their relationship that marriage itself is just another unpleasant task in their days of hard work and hardships ...

No matter how long they have been married, many women are frequently unhappy in their marriages. Some doubt their wisdom in their choice of husbands; a few of these ladies call me. Conversation ranges from feelings of despair, "What do I do now?"to, "I should've never married this guy...I'm done!" To the former, I usually respond, "What do you think you should do?" (There's little to say to those who have already made up their minds.)

We always have a choice. Since you consider yourself a Christian, the bible likely will play a role in your decision-making process. So, we will first look there for answers. Let's begin at the beginning...

Genesis 2:24, "Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh."

Genesis 3:16, "Unto the woman he said, I will

greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee.

Subsequent Old Testament books discuss the importance of fidelity before and after marriage and the obligation of the husband to care for his wife as well as reasons to "write her a bill of divorcement" and "send her out of his house." These books are replete with stories about wives, but always and only with mention of their husbands and they never give wives the right to make any decisions regarding the status of their marriages.

What about the New Testament?

Jesus quoted the same Scriptures when asked about marriage and divorce, "For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and cleave to his wife; And they twain shall be one flesh: so then they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder." (Mark 10:7-9)

He further elaborated, "And if a woman shall ... be married to another, she committeth adultery." (Mark 10:12).

The last time we see Jesus discussing marriage had little to do with marriage itself but is in response to a question posed by the Sadducees, "... The children of this world marry, and are given in marriage: But they which shall be accounted worthy to obtain that world, and the resurrection from the dead, neither marry, nor are given in mar*riage:*" (Luke 20:34-35)

The Apostle Paul (whom no one seems to agree on whether he himself had ever been married) seems to discourage marriage unless sex cannot be avoided.

Furthermore, he explains that God may allow divorce (Because of hardness of heart?) but never allows for re-marriage,

"Now concerning the things whereof ve wrote unto me: It is good for a man not to touch a woman. Nevertheless, to avoid fornication, let every man have his own wife, and let every woman have her own husband. I say therefore to the unmarried and widows, It is good for them if they abide even as I [unmarried?]. But if they cannot contain, let them marry: for it is better to marry than to burn. And unto the married I command, yet not *I*, but the Lord, Let not the wife depart from her husband: But and if she depart, let her remain

unmarried, or be reconciled to her husband: and let not the husband put away his wife." (1 Corinthians 7:1-11)

So, if we are to take the bible for what it says regarding marriage and divorce:

> 1) Men have the choice to divorce their wives (not the other way around) and

2) If a wife finds herself divorced by her husband, she is not free to marry again.

A Red Checkered Apron Recipe

Sour Dough Cowboy Biscuits



5 cups flour, ¹/₂ cup sugar ¹/₂ c. shortening, 1 tsp. salt 4 tsp baking powder ¹/₄ tsp soda 2 pkgs. yeast dissolved in ³/₄ c warm water 2 c. buttermilk

Mix well. Store in greased bowl in the refrigerator (up to 2 wks). Make out biscuits; let rise 30 minutes. Bake in 400 oven.
