Sacred New Year,
Passover,
Feast of Unleavened
Bread, and... EASTER?



Are you wondering just what the duty of the Biblical Christian is toward the holy days that approach? Read on!

Opinions, it seems, are as plenteous as individual beliefs. It seems every denomination holds to one of two main concepts of Passover:

- 1) The Jewish frame of reference, i.e., shank bones, bitter herbs, an egg and a prayer (no disrespect intended); and
- 2) The Christian observation, namely, "The Lord's Supper."

Within these two opposites there are many variations - some even straddle the middle ground attempting to capture and include facets and aspects of each. Although honorable in their own ways, both have little to do with the *Scriptural truth of Passover*.

Are the people of Jehovah to keep Passover? Are we to keep a "Lord's Supper?" What about an amalgamation of both? Let's see what the traditions are and how they compare to the Scriptures.

Many hold to the traditional understandings of "The Lord's Supper" and believe it to be a *replacement* for Passover. This rite, along with Baptism, is considered to be (what the Catholic church calls) "sacraments." They, (the Catholics and her Protestant daughter denominations) teach that these ceremonies are *essential* for salvation (thus the term, "sacraments"). I certainly wouldn't say they are essential – not without being unfaithful to the clear doctrines of atonement for sin accorded by the blood of Joshua (Jesus) alone.

Other denominations, while NOT requiring the Eucharist (Lord's Supper) for salvation, *do* require membership in their sects to *participate* in these rituals. True communion is a deep and broad subject that I will leave to another forum (See question # 120 from my book, *The Questions of Jesus*, "Where is the Guest Chamber?"). Today, we will deal only with the form of *communion*.

Anyone who desires communion (the bread and wine ritual) will quickly say that it is a form, a *representation* of a deeper spiritual reality. According to the teaching of the Scriptures, there is not to be **any** emblematic ritual scheduled by the "church" and led by the "pastor."

The Passover, as well as many of the Feasts of the Lord, is to be a *domestic* occasion. It is to be a quiet and private event with no intermediary (pastor or rabbi.) This is to be a time to commune with our God – it is a *personal* affair.

You see, the ego of men has corrupted the beautiful idea of private worship and dedication. We should have no part of anything that is based in pride, ego, ritual, or tradition. Neither are we to engage ourselves in a mere symbol of true communion. The "Lord's Supper" is a ritual merely portrays a quality or condition (real or not) of the persons participating. Just because you *take* communion does not mean you *have* communion.

By definition, if the bread and the wine is taken *to show* our faith, it is hypocrisy! Here's the warning in red,

"Beware of the scribes, [who] for a show make long prayers: the same shall receive greater damnation."

Luke 20:46-47

It was not their prayers or the length of their prayers that were wrong. The problem was the *reason* the Pharisees were praying. They wanted to show others (to *display*) their elevated Spiritual condition.

Does the Bible ever say that anyone who neglects the Lord's Supper or avoids baptism in water, even that same soul shall be cut off from among His people? I have not found it! Still more people believe in the *essential* nature of communion than ever keep the Creator's Calendar of events. Instead more time is spent arguing about obscurities, like:

- 1. Can grape juice be used instead of wine?
- 2. Can wafers bought at the Christian bookstore suffice or will saltines do the trick?
- 3. Can the bread contain leaven (and what is leaven)?
- 4. Was Judas in the room when the Lord passed the bread and wine?

Forever!

Many questions about this ceremony were largely instituted by the Catholics and propagated by the traditions of men. Unfortunately, most people won't take fifteen minutes to read about (much less actually observe) the Feasts of the Lord which are clearly outlined in Scriptures:

The Feast of Unleavened Bread: "And ye shall observe the feast of unleavened bread; for in this selfsame day have I brought your armies out of the land of Egypt: therefore shall ye observe this day in your generations by an ordinance for ever." Exodus 12:17


The Day of Atonement: "And this shall be a statute for ever unto you: that in the seventh month, on the tenth day of the month, ye shall afflict your souls, and do no work at all ... For on that day shall the priest make an atonement for you ... It shall be a sabbath of rest unto you, and ye shall afflict your souls, by a statute for ever." Leviticus 16:29-31

The Feast of Weeks (Pentecost): "And ye shall proclaim

on the selfsame day, that it may be an holy convocation unto you: ye shall do no servile work therein: it shall be a statute **for ever** in all your dwellings throughout your generations."Leviticus23:21

The Feast of Tabernacles: "And ye shall keep it a feast unto the LORD seven days in the year. It shall be a statute for ever in your generations: ye shall celebrate it in the seventh month." Leviticus 23:41

Passover - A Memorial

"And this day shall be unto you for a memorial; and ye shall keep it a feast to the LORD throughout your generations; ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance for ever." Exodus 12:14

Yes, these Feasts are *forever*! But, notice a term shows up describing the Passover Feast that we dare not miss. The subtle of the use of the word *memorial* in this Commandment must be noted or we may again find ourselves engaged in sacrilege, and the abominable heresy we are all trying to avoid!

Let's look at the Feasts and the key words associated with their imperative observance:

Unleavened Bread --- You will *observe* it Atonement --- You will afflict your souls Pentecost ---You will *proclaim* it Tabernacles --- You will *celebrate* it Sabbath ---You will *keep* it Passover --- It shall be a *memorial*

Is there a difference with Passover? Yes, there must be, because in order to keep a *Biblical* Passover, a lamb



must be slain. Its blood *must* be put over our door posts. We *must* eat bitter herbs - and do so with staffs in hand - and with shoes on our feet.

BEWARE!

TO KEEP THE PASSOVER IN *PRACTICE* IS MUCH DIFFERENT THAN TO KEEP IT IN *MEMORIAL*.

When you first began to keep the Sabbath, did your fellow Christians ask you right from the start, "Now that you are keeping the Law are you also going to also kill sacrifices?" As aggravating and unnerving as this question is, it makes a good point.

It is hypocritical to claim to keep the Law, to insist the Law has not changed and to declare that Jesus has not done away with the Feasts *IF* we do not keep the Law in its entirety!

The Apostle Paul Was Right!

"If therefore perfection were by the Levitical priesthood, (for under it the people received the law) what further need was there that another priest should rise after the order of Melchisedec...? For the priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change also of the law." Hebrews 7:11-12.

The Scripture plainly reads that there has been a change in the Law! Jesus changed the *practice* of the Passover by offering *Himself* as the Sacrificial Lamb. Otherwise, in order to keep the Law, we would be compelled to offend the sacrifice of Messiah by continuing to offer blood sacrifices.

Passover is a celebration that prophesied the Gospel event. It is a picture of the death and blood of Messiah poured out for us and spread over the door upon which He

"CRUCIFIXION" WEEK TIMELINE

Q - If Passover is always on a different calendar day according to the new moon sighting, why is First Fruits on a sun-day regardless of the Passover date?

A – Day of Firstfruits is always on the sun-day. Pentecost is always on the sun-day because we are to count 50 days beginning with the weekly Sabbath – 7 Sabbaths, plus 1 day = a sun-day.

Leviticus 23:11, "And he shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, to be accepted for you: on the morrow after the sabbath the priest shall wave it."

Q - Why does First Fruits have a set date, but Passover does not?

A - Passover does have a set date. It is always on the 14th day of the First Month.

Q - If Passover, Unleavened Bread, and Firstfruits are all be based on the New Moon sighting, the beginning of the month, 14 days later. How can Jesus have risen on First Fruits 72 hours later if Day of First Fruits is always on the same day?

A – Here's a time line of the crucifixion week. A Time line is also included in the DVD "Reconciling the Resurrection" and is available for the asking. REMEMBER, DAYS ARE SUNSET TO SUNSET.

(Tues) – Jesus had supper with his disciples – the day before Passover (he was to be killed as our Passover the following day:

John 6:4, "And the passover, a feast of the Jews, was nigh."

Luke 22:15, "And he said unto them, With desire I have desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer:"

Luke 22:18, "For I say unto you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine, until the kingdom of God shall come."

(Wed)- Jesus died and was buried just before sunset:

Matthew 27:46, "And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken"

And he was buried hurriedly before the called Sabbath at the beginning of the Feast of Unleavened Bread:

Leviticus 23:6-7, "And on the fifteenth day of the same month is the feast of unleavened bread unto the LORD: seven days ye must eat unleavened bread. In the first day ye shall have an holy convocation: ye shall do no servile work therein."

STRONGS #1766 ennatos {en'-nat-os} ordinal from 1767;; adj - ninth 10; 10 Ninth - the ninth hour corresponds to our 3 o'clock in the afternoon for the sixth hour of the Jews coincides with the twelfth of day as divided by our method, and the first hour of the day is 6 A.M. to us

(Thurs) - Nothing was done a called Sabbath day until after sunset- the first day of the feast of unleavened bread.

(Fri) - Nothing was done - soldiers guarded the tomb



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Reconciling the Resurrection

Matthew 28 (blue) Mark 16 (red) Luke 24 (black) John 20 (green)

In the end of the Sabbath, as it began to dawn toward the first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre and said, Who shall roll away the stone from the door of the sepulchre? And, behold, there was a great earthquake: for the angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat upon it. His countenance was like lightning and his raiment white as

snow: And for fear of him, the keepers did shake, and became as dead men. And the angel answered and said, Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified. He is not here: for he is risen, as he said. And they went out quickly, and flee from the sepulchre; for they trembled and were amazed: neither said they anything to any man for they were afraid.

Now upon the first day of the week, they came [again] unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, they, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, Joanna and Salome and certain others with them, came to see the sepulchre. And when they looked, they found the stone rolled away from the sepulchre for it was very great. And they entered into the sepulchre and found not the body of the Lord Jesus. And it came to pass, as they were much perplexed thereabout, they saw two young men in shining garments; And as they were afraid, and bowed down their faces to the earth, they said unto them, Ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, which was crucified; he is risen; he is not here remember how he spake unto you when he was yet in Galilee, Saying, The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again. Come, see the place wither the Lord lay. Go quickly and tell his disciples and Peter that he is risen from the dead and, behold, he goeth before you into Galilee; there shall ye see him: lo, I have told you. And they departed quickly from the sepulchre with fear and great joy; and did run to bring his disciples word, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, they have taken away the Lord out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him. And they remembered his words, and returned from the sepulchre, and told all these things unto the eleven, and to all the rest. Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre. So they ran both together; and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre. And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the linen clothes lying; yet went he not in. Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the sepulchre. And seeing the linen clothes lie, and the napkin, that was about this head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place by itself. Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw and believed. For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must rise again from the dead. Then the disciples went away again unto their own homes. But Mary stood without at the sepulchre weeping: Jesus saith unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou? She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and I will take him away. Jesus saith unto her, Mary.

knocks begging to enter!

There can be no more sacrifices! There is no longer any *need* for them. There can be no more atonement! There can only be, and there *must* be, a *memorial*, a remembrance of what *He* has done for us!

Jesus gave us a red-letter hint that changes would occur in this Feast when He changed the element from a blood food to bread and set aside the cup saying, "For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.But I say unto you, I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom." Matthew 26:28-29

No longer are we to participate in empty rituals of cups and broken bread, but rather a *solemn night of remembrance* and *worship*. No symbols to clutter our thinking and split our congregations, no Jewish fables and traditions to divert us from the truth, the night of His passion has become "The Night to be Much Observed".

"It is a night to be much observed unto the LORD for bringing them out from the land of Egypt: this is that night of the LORD to be observed of all the children of Israel in their generations." Exodus 12:42

Soon, we will gather at our dinner tables just as we do every night, but on Passover evening it will be different. It will be different only in this respect, when we lift our cup ("... as oft as ye do this") we will remember His blood. As we eat our bread, we will recall the Bread of Life broken on this very night long ago. Not the Passover of 3500 years ago, but of 2000 years ago. We will remember not just a lamb, we remember THE LAMB.

Passover is Father's Day. Just before sundown on the 14th day of the first month on the calendar of Jehovah,

From the Scriptures...

From the Scriptures (and not by what everyone says about the Scriptures, we have determined that yeast was indeed the leavening agent prohibited. We have never been able to scripturally include any other elements as leavening agents. The red words say, "...like unto leaven, which a woman took, and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened." (Matthew 13:33)

Only yeast can "...leaven a whole lump" from a small portion.

Only yeast will reappear out of thin air in as little as seven days. Baking soda, baking powder, eggs and every other leavening agent found in the long lists of Jewish "leavens" lack this characteristic of self-multiplication. Only yeast is alive and actually reproduces itself.

Now that we understand that leaven was used to illustrate the important lesson of avoiding hypocrisy in our lives, we will do our best to convey this idea using the same illustration while allowing those without this understanding an opportunity to obey with good conscience- rather than condemnation from others.

Pam and I strongly believe that the message is clear to those having "...ears to hear" and although we have no intention on breaking any of His ordinances nor compromising our own consciences, we must allow others to develop their own relationships with their Father.

We believe that we should be diligent about searching out, discovering and eliminating yeast in all food stuffs during the Feast of Unleavened Bread and obey this ordinance as a matter of accuracy according to the Scriptures and not for fear of condemnation. Therefore, it gives us the freedom and ability to love, help, and teach our neighbors to observe this Feast as is our privilege to do.

In short, we will obey what we know to do and not dictate these things to those who do not have this understand without condemnation of others.

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).
- 2. In a large bowl, stir together, flour, sugar and salt. Add water, 1 egg white and melted butter; mix well to make a stiff dough. Knead until dough is smooth, about 5 minutes.
- 3. Divide dough into 10 balls. Roll each ball on lightly floured surface until paper thin. Place on ungreased baking sheet. Brush with egg white and sprinkle with sesame seeds.
- 4. Bake in preheated oven for 10 to 12 minutes, until browned.
