REPLY FROM DOM: Actually, the Bible addresses the Holy Spirit both ways. The Scriptures refer to "Him as It" and "It as Him". My main concern is to ask you is why would you be addressing Him at all? If by address you simply mean to refer to I have no problem with either "It or Him." If what you mean by address is to speak to the Holy Spirit, in the Scriptures I find no example, commandment or instruction for us to address the Holy Spirit at all.

It's not well known but the New Testament does not even instruct us to pray to Jesus... but to the Father, in His name. This is easily seen in the words of Christ when he declares, "...in that day (after Jesus ascends to heaven) ye shall ask me nothing. But whatsoever you ask the Father in my name..."

I know how you feel, not wanting to address the Holy Spirit as "It". But, I assure you it is only a residual misunderstanding of "the Trinity." Nowhere does the Bible refer to the Holy Spirit as a person. Hope this helps.

As for your second question, transgender is a sensitive subject and in most cases an unfair evaluation is made because of our lack of ability to understand such behavior. Transgender is the ultimate evolution of transvestite. There are some who would condemn transgender, but would tolerate a transvestite. It all depends on where you draw the line. Someone has taught the transgender too hate their sex they, therefore, they make efforts to hide by clothing (as transvestite) and later even by surgery that which they are ashamed of. Although I understand it is the extreme end of the spectrum, when you trace behavior back to its origin, it is hardly more sinister than a woman using make-up. Let's face facts, we cover and try to change what we are ashamed of or hate about ourselves. Whether it's a man hiding his beer belly hanging over his belt with loose clothing or a woman dissatisfied with the color of her lips, we cover, obfuscate and try to change by all means possible that which our twisted selfish mind considers to be less than perfect.

If we are not careful we will find ourselves feeling justified in rejecting those who simply suffer from an exaggerated form of low self esteem. The object for us is to never cause a critical evaluation of deviant behavior except in the poor soul who is caught in it and cannot see it himself. This easily translates to Jesus' example of the mote and the beam. (Click to hear Question of Jesus #9.)

We live in a world of hurting people. The horrific treatment of children by sinful parents is rampant. These behaviors are markers to those of us who are able, with Christ dwelling in us, to love them. If they have any tendency to want to know why they are so different, someone has to help them. Better it be a Christian who can love them, than some silly psychologist who teaches them that there is no such thing as deviant behavior. The rule always is love first.

REPLY FROM DON: It sounds to me like you were paying very close attention. Actually, you have it right. I became very suspicious about the fact that there was only one Scripture in the bible that was used as verification for church attendance, and decided to investigate. It was immediately a curiosity that the subject of the surrounding passages had so much to do with judgment and not a word about attendance of a meeting, church, or congregation. Although I happen to believe strongly in Sabbath day observance, the conversion of the commandment "a day of rest" to "a day of worship" was glaring.

The admonition to not forget "the day" that is approaching, the day in which we will all assemble ourselves together, it becomes very clearly the day of judgment - as the scripture continues to speak of that day of judgment.

Let me see if I can put the scripture into modern English vernacular.

We should always remember that it is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of a living God. We should never forget that one day we will assemble before Him as our judge. Many people do not practice this in their daily lives. We must hold fast our profession of faith and provoke one another to do the same. If we don't, if we sin willfully, there remains nothing left for us but to face of that day of judgment with fear of the fiery indignation that will devour us along with the adversaries. With judgment in mind instead of Sunday church-going, this Scripture and its message rings clear. I cannot help but believe this was a purposeful obscuration of a dire warning.

Could there be a person on earth anywhere that actually believes that church attendance will prevent them from suffering the judgment of an evil doer? I hope not.

Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;) And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching. For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins, But a certain fearful looking for of judgment and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries.

REPLY FROM DON: If the Lord YHVH listed everything He was not that people said He is, our Bible would have to be three times bigger. If He thought it was important that we know that He is a triune being and wishes to be known as such, isn't it odd that He never mentioned it? When the bible speaks of godhead, it indicates that God is a plural being, as He is indeed. The name Elohim indicates plurality as well. Even the places that use the term echad speak not of singularity, but of unity. We would have to come to the conclusion that unity necessarily requires more than one being in order to achieve unity.

The relationship of Jesus Christ to His Father, YHVH has been a changing relationship from the beginning until now. Although we do not know what His pre-incarnate relationship was we do know that at the coronation of Jesus Christ spoken of in Hebrews, our Lord God clearly says, "This day..." "This day have I begotten thee."

The word son is used in the bible many different ways. Many times it is simply a form of diminutive honor bestowed from greater to lessor. It does not necessarily mean "biological progeny." In any case one would be hard pressed to find any New Testament Scripture that lists the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit in the same sentence, other than the two dubious Scriptures, namely, 1 John 1:9 and Matt 28:19, both suspect of being subsequent additions to the Scriptures.

So, what does this leave us? It leaves us to populate the godhead with the Father and the Son as Paul did constantly and consistently throughout his writings. There is no reason to believe anything else. The godhead, clearly, scripturally and historically contains only two persons. According to the Scripture (1 John 2:22) we are not allowed to disregard one being from the godhead equation without penalty. I can only surmise that if the removal of one being is not permitted, certainly the addition of one is risky behavior. Therefore, I have chosen to remove the word trinity from my vocabulary and doctrine, and certainly from my understanding of who the godhead is. Is this a denial of the Holy Spirit? Absolutely not. The Holy Spirit remains alive and well for if you will receive it, the Holy Spirit is none other than God Himself. As our Lord Jesus said so clearly, "God is a Spirit." Really, what else do we need to know? In what study must we laboriously engage ourselves? These studies lead to wild conjecture as you have personally experienced! Why expend any effort in trying to prove or even disprove a ridiculous Catholic doctrine of relatively recent origin? It's a waste of time.

I was taught, as you were, that it was not possible for His elect to be deceived. I would like to dispossess you such a foolish notion. I was awakened in the middle of the night with the LORD explaining to me, warning me, that we should not take the words "if it were possible" from the familiar Scripture "...deceive (if it were possible) the very elect..." as some promise that deception cannot touch us. That Scripture is better read, "...even His elect will be deceived if possible." It is not God, but us, who facilitates the impossibility of our deception. It is possible for any of us to be deceived...even the very elect.
