UNANSWERED QUESTIONS (FROM THE LAST ISSUE)

- Are we lacking in power because we do not know a secret that our God has hidden from us?
- Are we at the mercy of our emotions because we lack a certain pharmaceutical concoction in our brains?
- Are we selfish and egocentric because we have no counselors to teach us differently?
- Do we hunger for spiritual food and drink because we lack good Bible teachers?
- Why do we think that a better doctor or attendance at a seminar or advice from the right theologian will help us?

Life continues to kick us around, our emotions still overcome us, we exhibit less and less self control and we find it harder and harder to love those who do not love us... because...

We are deceived:

Today is the day to release fantasy and pretense If we are to emerge from this quagmire of our deception we must make positive steps. The first step that gains us ground on our journey toward completeness and a life that pleases God, is to accept only what is *true* from any source. This may seem an impossible task, a vaporous notion, or just an ethereal platitude, but it is not as difficult, or as elusive, as you may think. One has a tendency to deny the *reasonableness* of such an effort because of the *impossibility* of recognizing deep deception. But, the deep deception is not where the problem started.

The first step to being less susceptible to deep deception is the elimination of any and all falseness from our lives. It is the lie that we openly and knowingly welcome into our lives that makes way for the deeper deception. When we toy with fantasy or even a desire for things to be different than they are in reality, the line between real and unreal becomes fuzzy, and reason becomes difficult. Fictional journeys we take in our minds facilitated by movies and novels, even daydreaming, none of which are not conducive to Truth. If we are to gain the life intended for us, we need to think upon what is real and provable and accurate – eliminating fairy tales, superstitions and traditions that have no spiritual value (Therefore no value to the life of a Christian). These ridiculous notions of sinful men are found in nearly every aspect of human endeavor.

The Church is not immune to fiction. Rather, the Church world is infested with superstitions and traditions that have no place in the worship of a real and holy God. Nearly every sermon and almost every song strays into false doctrine, Romanism and pagan mysticism. Their implications create inferences in the mind of the hearer – inferences of theological "facts" that are not facts at all, but are in reality only vain imaginations of an unregenerate mind. Soon, ideas built upon these false premises are accepted by nearly everyone, even though they have no basis in truth.

After this process moves across a couple of generations, the false notions can mature into "doctrine" simply by virtue of being "tradition" and become so deeply ingrained it can hardly ever be totally erased. If we accept any and every thing handed to us as truth by sinful men in the name of God, we may NEVER find the answers for our difficult and complex lives.

If our minds are saturated with a fictional understanding of God, how can we ever worship Him, as we are commanded to, in Spirit, and in Truth? We know by the testimony of Christ that it is the Truth that sets us free, but, if we cannot recognize Truth when we hear it, how will we ever break the bond of sin over which we now seem to have no power?

Jesus faced this complex situation when he emerged in Israel.

- Custom had become ritual.
- False notions and presumption had become tradition.
- Tradition was beginning to concretize into doctrine.
- Doctrine into dogma.

• Dogma reigned supreme.

Unfortunately, through all this transmigration of Truth, the Law of Jehovah was forsaken, and mercy was nearly unknown.

There are millions who live this way in their spiritual lives as well. They dare not challenge any aspect of their faith for fear of the entire house of cards falling flat. Unfortunately, because Truth has become dispensable, they have unwittingly prepared and positioned themselves to again place their trust in sinful man, accept false doctrine, and wonder why they have no capacity or inclination to accomplish even the simplest of Christian service.

Although we may read Jesus' words telling us that we will have power over the enemy, those who follow Christ, in our day and age, cannot even seem to garner the strength to deny any of their slightest indulgences. Jesus said with mustard seed faith we can move mountains by simply saying to it, "Move!" Yet *we*, in our pitiful state of self-interest, cannot even deflect our daily licentiousness, foolish habits, or petty hatred no matter what we profess or declare to the contrary.

- Is what Christ taught an exaggeration?
- Have we misunderstood?
- Are we really to expect signs of grace and power to accompany the believer, or are these just exaggerations, embellishments, or fancies of overzealous Bible writers?

We will not find answers to these or any other questions as long as we willingly accept deception into our minds, never assaying sources or requiring concepts presented to us to stand upon firm and provable grounds. It is obvious that if we are to eliminate what is fraudulent in our *understanding*, we are going to have to pay attention to what we allow to come into our *thoughts*, masquerading as Truth. We cannot build a sure foundation upon the sand of fable, fantasy, or man's wisdom. We must trust no man, but study in order to show ourselves as approved as servants of God, listening only to the "Word of God" which, according to the Scriptures 1, is none other than Christ within us.

Jesus taught that a house built upon sand would fall when tried by storm $\lfloor 2 \rfloor$ He told of a "fool" who had built his life upon faith without works. The man heard the words of Jesus, perhaps every time the doors of his church were open, but the foolish man did not DO them. But the one, who not only heard His words but did them as well, was wise and his house was built surely upon rock.

We must eliminate lies.

...We know inherently that God expects a certain standard of moral living, a repentant and broken spirit, and a life of denial and simplicity, of humility and kindness to others. We only accept the lies we are told to the contrary because we want to believe they are true. We only accept the lies we are told because the lies let us do what we want to do, meanwhile salving our sore and grieving consciences.


