Days of Counting

The "counting of the omer" (like many Jewish additions to the Biblical Calendar) has caused another bump in the otherwise smooth road of revelation and perfection.

"Counting omers" are part of the takanot and maasim (manmade, verbal laws and traditions) which have complicated Sabbath observance, Passover memorial, and several other accepted ideas that have become doctrines.

Just as the "Rosh Hashanah" obscures the true beginning of the sacred year, the "counting of omers" has obscured yet another great lesson intended for those who keep the Shavuot (Pentecost) – and those who wait to hear the voice of God. Jesus spoke of all these things as "the traditions of men."

Does anyone really enjoy waiting? You may have heard me play the cut from an old rock song from "Queen" called "I Want It All". Although I do not (nor do I want to know) who "Queen" is, this song is the quintessential theme for modern man, for the chorus goes "I want it all! ... I want it all! ... I want it ALL! ... I want it now!



Waiting is a lost art for the modern "microwave man". The Church is no exception. Just as soon as the LORD YHVH reveals an idea,

we set upon sharing it... NOW! As time goes by, the rest of the revelation comes. Then, lo and behold, we got it all wrong. In many cases, the rest of the revelation never comes – because we have proven ourselves untrustworthy to receive the whole of the revelation.

Is half a revelation better than none at all?

We may also take instruction from Habakkuk 2:1-3: "... the LORD answered me, and said, Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may run that readeth it. For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry."

If we are unsure, we cannot "run." Time waiting WILL make us sure.

Otherwise, we tip-toe – or run blindly.

What if Daniel had run"by faith?"

In other words, what if Daniel had not waited [the 21 days] until he heard from the Lord, but merely *"believed"* that he inherently knew the answer to his prayers? (Daniel 10)

What if Gideon (Judges 6) had been satisfied to accept his commission before he was made sure of it? Could he have been the faithful leader he became?

What of Job who waited, "...all the days of my appointed time ... till my change come." (Job 14:14) Could James (5:11) have testified of Job as a monument of faith and patience:

"Behold, we count them happy which endure [wait]. Ye have heard of the patience of Job, and have seen the end of the Lord; that the Lord is very pitiful, and of tender mercy."

It is clear from these examples (and many others) that men and women of YHVH WAIT upon the LORD. It is equally clear that we do not receive all knowledge in one brushing encounter with YHVH.

If we are constantly bombarded by the faults and short-comings of our fellowman - it is hard to love them. Mostly, we feel like they have better sense, common sense or that they do what they do - on purpose. This aspect is missing in our pets. Our neighbor cannot come and vomit on our carpet or urinate in our pile of clean clothes to be folded and be loved by us as much as we love our pets after they do such things. We make allowances for our pets that is why they are easy to love.

Are you beginning to see that we need to make allowances for one another?

If we did judge our neighbor the way we judge our pets (and ourselves), we would enjoy his company more - no matter what he did or said; will do or will say. It's the allowances. It's always the allowances. It is likely true that we are worse than our neighbors. We excuse ourselves too easily.

I've enclosed a paper by C. S. Lewis called <u>"The Trouble with X"</u>. Find some quiet time to read this intently. I can't express strongly enough how important it is that you get this right. It's not only the singular Scripture that says, "Do unto others as you'd have them do unto you" but, you'll find that this is an imperative set forth by the entire New Testament; and a point upon which our judgment can turn. Use this disquiet in your soul as an indicator that's pointing out a need for regeneration.
